Seed Change


“We can't solve a problem with the same mindset that created the problem; a seed change is required.”






Budget



The Sustainability Team incorporates the 6 departments that historically have addressed the County's physical infrastructure and the built environment.



While this group of departments' impact on the operating budget is small at 3%, that allocation is used to leverage the >\$70M in capital and other infrastructure spending.




2023 Implementation

- Baseline of Existing Open Space Parcels (*GIS*)
- Tree Canopy RFP (*DCOS/GIS*)
- Conservation Mini-Grants for Riparian Buffers and other projects for improving water quality (*Conservation*)
- Create a watershed group for Naamans, Marcus Hook, Stoney Creek Watershed (*Clean Air Council*)
- Identify baseline sidewalk inventory (*GIS*)
- Create a Vision Zero Plan (*Planning*)
- Create model design guidelines for safe bike crossings (*DVRPC*)
- Implement off-hours energy reduction through lighting schedules (*DCOS/Facilities*)
- “Right-size” the recycling program to ensure adequate receptacles, staffing and other resources meet county needs (*DCOS*)
- Create a pilot composting program at the Government Center (*DCOS*)
- Increase community air quality monitoring throughout the County to better gauge air quality in all communities (*Planning/CAA*)
- Installation of additional community gardens (*Parks*)


